The DFL affirm its commitment to the First Amendment of the US Constitution by including in its platform repeal of the two laws passed in 2017, Minnesota Statutes 3.226 and 16C.053.which limit the right of Minnesotans to exercise rights to boycott as expression of free speech.

Two laws, passed in 2017, seek to prevent people from employment or doing business with the State of Minnesota if they support the Boycott, Divest, Sanctions movement (BDS), an international initiative that aims to use nonviolent means to challenge Israel's abuses of the human rights of the Palestinian people within Israel and the militarily-occupied West Bank and Gaza.

These laws are unconstitutional, because the US Supreme Court has ruled that the right to boycott is protected under the First Amendment. Therefore, the Legislature must repeal these laws.
